

## Biodata: Barry Lee Reynolds, Shizhou Yang, & Melissa H. Yu



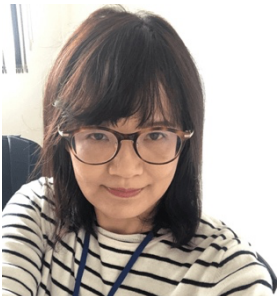
