Manuscript guidelines

- 1. Articles should be typed, doublespaced, and no more than 20 pages. References should be cited in parentheses in the text by author's last name, year of publication and page numbers. For example, "The findings were reported (Jones 1979: 23-45) although they caused no change in policy." In other words, author's last name, publication date of work cited and page number(s).
- 2. The list of references in an article must appear at the end of the text on a separate page titled 'References'. Data must be complete and accurate. The following format should be followed:

For books: Jones, T.J. 1984. How to Spell. New York: ABC

For articles: Moore, Jane. 1948. "Why I Love to Teach English." Forum, June, 56-64.

Pérez, Beatriz. 1962. "El Griego Antiguo en Quince Días." La Revista de la Universidad, 10(2), 136-139.

3. Three copies of each manuscript, including all appendices, tables, graphs, etc., are required.
